Bylaws Change Recommended... Article X Committee (add) Section 4

The President shall appoint a Lifetime Membership Committee Chairperson, who is an active Lifetime member of Mountain Laurel Skiers. The Chairperson will select three (3) Lifetime Members to be on the Committee, and the committee shall include the Membership Chairperson/Vice President and the President (as an ex-officio member of all Committees). The Chairperson and his/her committee may submit no recommendation or up to three (3) Mountain Laurel member names (recommendations) eligible for Lifetime Membership to the Board of Directors. The Board of Directors shall vote and approve only one (1) of the three (3) member names (recommendations) that are eligible for the honor of Lifetime Membership.

Article III Section 3C (add)

Lifetime Membership member(s)/candidates(s), must meet the following criteria: be a member of the Mt Laurel Ski Club for a minimum of ten (10) years; serve as an Officer (President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, and/or Assistant Secretary/Treasurer), serve as chairperson(s) for committee(s), and whose contributions are considered significant. The Board of Directors may only bestow this honor based on the member names (recommendations) presented by the Lifetime Membership Committee. A member will be selected for the honor and be approved by the Board of Directors. (see Article X Section 4).

By-law changes must be published and approved by the membership in accordance with Article XII Amendments and Article IX Section 4 and 5 Meetings. The by-Law change is being published in the January Newsletter and will be voted on at the January 30, 2008 meeting.

And speaking of nachos.....the Lodge Committee has addressed emergency evacuation procedures to be followed in the event of a fire. Be aware that you will be unable to use the lodge phone to call 911 as it will be deactivated by the alarm system. The first course of action is to leave the building immediately! Do not go back to your room to retrieve personal belongings. The designated meeting area is in front of the electric company building, which is located to the right of the lodge driveway (as you are facing the lodge). Do not go to the parking area in the rear of the lodge! The innkeeper will be responsible for coordinating a head count of those who are present at the lodge at the time of the fire. There are fire ladders in all of the upstairs bedrooms except Okemo. They will be stored under the bed located closest to the emergency exit window, and a sign designating their location will be posted on the beds. Please acquaint yourself with the location of the fire ladders, and make sure that they are easily accessible and not hidden under your luggage. There should be clear access to the emergency exit window.

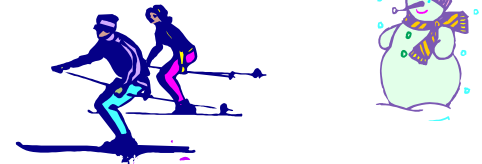

ELITE	You know who you are. <i>"No guts, no glory!"</i>
A	Advanced skier who runs gates often. <i>"Be good or eat wood!"</i>
B	Intermediate skier who runs gates, or an advanced skier who does not race. <i>"You can do it!"</i>
UPPER C (C+)	Advanced novice who can ski the course from the top with wide turns. Skiing the lower part would not be a challenge. Does not belong with beginners. <i>"Go for it!"</i>
LOWER C (C-)	Beginner skier; no racing experience. A novice skier who finds intermediate slopes a challenge. <i>"Try it. You'll like it."</i>
UPPER COURSE JUNIOR "A"	Under the age of 18. Advanced novice who can ski the course from the top with wide turns. Skiing the lower part would not be a challenge.
LOWER COURSE JUNIOR "B"	Under the age of 18. Beginner skier; no racing experience.

- **ADULT MEMBER LIFT TICKETS: Purchase ticket at signup location at special price.**
- **JUNIOR MEMBER LIFT TICKETS: No Charge!!** Lift ticket will be purchased by the Club. (Age 17 & under), For children and grandchildren of members and prospective members.
- **NON-MEMBERS:** Lift Tickets for Adults and Juniors will be available for purchase at the Group Rate the day of the race.
- **RACE REGISTRATION:** 8:00am to 9:15am. Place : **Base Lodge.**
- **RACE ORDER – BE ON TIME!!! This year's race will be on "Showoff".** The race will start at 11 am. The Race starts in Bib Order, beginning with "B" Junior Girls & Boys, Lower C Women and Lower C Men.
